Polly Wolly Doodle Mitts

I created these mitts to match with the Polly Wolly Doodle Hat

Size

• For small hands (S/M) and thin wrist (15 cm / 6 inch circumference)

Material

- 3,75 mm (US 5) circular needle, 40 inch long for magic loop
- 4,5 mm (US 7) circular needle, 40 inch long for magic loop
- 1 cable needle
- 1 stitch holder
- about 200 m (218 yd) of any yarn that is knitted with this needle size. Don't choose a too fluffy one, for a nice stitch definition.
- I used some stash yarn so it's difficult to tell you how long you need, I would say about 200 m (180 yd) for a pair.

Abreviations

- K knit
- P purl
- SL2CN slip 2 st onto cable needle and put on the back of the work
- K2CN knit the 2 st from cable needle
- KFB knit the same st from the front then the back loop (=1 increase)
- M 1 increase (knitted increase)

You need to know

- the magic loop method
- 1x1 rib knitted in round
- pick up st
- KFB increase, knitted increase

Nota and tips

- You can easily add 10 1x1 ribs at the beginning to get longer wrists if you prefer (I did this for the second pair I made)
- If you want to knit some medium or large size, use larger needle, and add 1 pattern repeat after the thumb (5 instead of 4) and 3 knitted rows for the thumb.
- I don't have cable needles, so for this very small cable,
 I use a tapestry needle

Instructions

1 - Left hand

Cast on 36 st with smaller needle and separate in 2x18 for magic loop. Join in round, taking care not to twist

R1 to R10: knit 10 rounds of 1x1 ribs

R11: change for larger needle and knit around

Starting cable pattern

R 12: K6, P2, (SL2CN, K1, K2CN, P2)x2, K to end

R 13 : K3, (K3, P2)x3, K to end R 14 : K3, (K3, P2)x3, K to end R 15 : K3, (K3, P2)x3, K to end

Repeat these 4 rows 3 more times. (rows 16 to 27)

Creating thumb gusset

R 28: K6, P2, (SL2CN, K1, K2CN, P2)x2, K to end

R 29: K2, KFB, (K3, P2)x3, K to 3 before end, KFB, K2

R 30: K4, (K3, P2)x3, K to end

R 31: K3, KFB, (K3, P2)x3, K to 4 before end, KFB, K3

R 32: K8, P2, (SL2CN, K1, K2CN, P2)x2, K to end

R 33: K4, KFB, (K3, P2)x3, K to 5 before end, KFB, K4

R 34 : K6, (K3, P2)x3, K to end

Separating thumb

Cut the yarn leaving a 6 inch tail for weaving R35: put 4 st on stitch holder, M1, K1, K3, (K3, P2)x3, K to 5 before end, M1, K1, put the 4 last st on stitch holder

Knitting hand

R 36: K6, P2, (SL2CN, K1, K2CN, P2)x2, K to end

R 37: K3, (K3, P2)x3, K to end

R 38: K3, (K3, P2)x3, K to end

R 39: K3, (K3, P2)x3, K to end

Repeat twice these 4 rows (rows 40 to 47)

R 48: knit around.

R 49 and 50 : change for smaller needle and knit 2 rounds of

1x1 ribs

Bind off not too loosely.

Knitting thumb

With larger needle pick the 8 st from stitch holder and pick 4 other st from hand of the mitt. Place marker at the beginning of the round

Knit 3 rounds

Change for smaller needle and knit 4 rounds of 1x1 ribs. Bind off and wave all ends.

Then start the right mitt ...

2 - Right hand

Cast on 36 st with smaller needle and separate in 2x18 for magic loop. Join in round, taking care not to twist

R1 to R10: knit 10 rounds of 1x1 ribs

R11: change for larger needle and knit around

Starting cable pattern

R 12: K18, P2, (SL2CN, K1, K2CN, P2)x2, K to end

R 13: K15, (K3, P2)x3, K to end

R 14 : K15, (K3, P2)x3, K to end

R 15 : K15, (K3, P2)x3, K to end

Repeat these 4 rows 3 more times. (rows 16 to 27)

Creating thumb gusset

R 28 : K18, P2, (SL2CN, K1, K2CN, P2)x2, K to end

R 29 : K2, KFB, K15, (P2, K3)x3, KFB, K2

R 30: K19, (P2, K3)x3, K to end

R 31: K3, KFB, K15, (P2, K3)x3, KFB, K3

R 32: K20, P2, (SL2CN, K1, K2CN, P2)x2, K to end

R 33: K4, KFB, K15, (P2, K3)x3, KFB, K4

R 34: K21, (P2, K3)x3, K to end

Separating thumb

Cut the yarn leaving a 6 inch tail for weaving R35: put 4 st on stitch holder, M1, K1, K16, (P2, K3)x3, M1, K2, put the 4 last st on stitch holder

Knitting hand

R 36: K18, (P2, SL2CN, K1, K2CN)x2, P2, K to end

R 37: K15, (K3, P2)x3, K to end

R 38: K15, (K3, P2)x3, K to end

R 39: K15, (K3, P2)x3, K to end

Repeat twice these 4 rows (rows 40 to 47)

R 48: knit around.

R 49 and 50: change for smaller needle and knit 2 rounds of

1x1 ribs

Bind off not too loosely.

Knitting thumb

With larger needle pick the 8 st from stitch holder and pick 4 other st from hand of the mitt. Place marker at the beginning of the round

Knit 3 rounds

Change for smaller needle and knit 4 rounds of 1x1 ribs. Bind off and wave all ends.

You're done. Block if you want, and enjoy!
